



- Andrew Norman is an American composer of contemporary classical music whose texturally complex music is influenced by architecture and the visual arts.
- Norman studied composition at the University of Southern California and Yale University.
- He was composer-in-residence for the Boston Modern Orchestra Project from 2011 to 2013.
- Among Norman's most notable works are the string trio, *The Companion Guide to Rome*, the symphony *Play*, the fantasy for piano and orchestra, *Split*, the opera *A Trip to the Moon*, and the orchestral work *Sustain*.
- His string trio *The Companion Guide to Rome*, was a runner-up for the 2012 Pulitzer Prize for Music.
- Norman is currently on the composition faculty of the Juilliard School, and served as Carnegie Hall's Debs Composer's Chair for the 2020–2021 season. He was previously an Assistant Professor of Composition at the USC Thornton School of Music.
