Alberto Ginastera (All-bare-toe JEE-nah-STEH-rah)



- Ginastera was born in Buenos Aires, Argentina.
- He began his music studies at an early age and when he was twelve, entered the Williams Conservatory.
- In 1945, Ginastera travelled to the United States where he became friends with Aaron Copland.
- Alberto Ginastera achieved international prominence after the successes of his ballet scores, Panambí and Estancia, which employed folkloric and nationalist influences of his native Argentina.



- His popular work for chamber orchestra, Variaciones concertantes, was composed in 1953 and won him even greater attention.
- Ginastera's works include several music genres: operas, ballets, orchestral works, concertos, cantatas, and chamber works.
